
#### **New Rules**

#### <u>2025</u>

- Abuse Awareness Certificate (Updated Link to training on slide 12)
- Out of boundary players will be All Star eligible in whichever league their younger (league age 4-7) sibling is registered. The younger sibling <u>MUST</u> have been registered in the league for the Spring season <u>AND</u> must have participated in the season.

#### <u>2023</u>

- Continuous batting order for all divisions below Juniors
- Free subs, players are no longer "married" to each other when subbing
- Regardless of roster size each team is allowed to have 3 coaches
- Special pinch runners are no longer allowed
- Courtesy Runners are now in play
  - A team must have 2 outs
  - Pitcher or catcher on base
  - Courtesy runner will be the player who made the last out
  - If the pitcher and the catcher are both on base with two outs you can use a courtesy runner for both players
- All Star managers and coaches are required to complete the Little League Diamond Leaders training.



### **Team Requirements**

- To register a tournament team your league must have chartered a regular season team in that same division.
- 8-10s, 9-11s, 10-12s, Intermediate and Juniors teams must have played in at least 12 regular season games.
- Seniors teams are not required to have played a minimum amount of regular season games to be eligible.
- Teams must have a minimum of 12 players rostered for each tournament team.
  - If a team does not have a minimum of 12 players this must be approved by the District Administrator.
- No alternate players are permitted on the roster.
- All teams can have 3 coaches regardless of the number of players on the roster.

## **Player Eligibility**

- Player must live or attend a physical school within your leagues boundaries.
  - Exception 1: A player who has submitted a waiver to District 1 and been approved through Western Region and be able to produce the approved waiver. This waiver should be included within the players All Star documentation packet in the team book.
  - Exception 2: A player who has a league age 4-7 year old sibling who is registered <u>AND</u> has completed the season with your league. The player will show as eligible in your affidavit as long as they have a younger sibling linked to them participating in your league.
- Regular season games played requirements:
  - 8-10s, 9-11s, 10-12s, Intermediate and Juniors **teams** must have played in at least 12 regular season games.
  - 8-10s, 9-11s, 10-12s, Intermediate and Juniors **players** must have participated in at least 8 regular season games.
    - Players who were injured during the season making them unable to participate in the minimum amount of games required must have an official doctor's note stating they were medically unable to participate but have been cleared. This documentation needs to be included in within the players All Star documentation packet in the team book.
  - Seniors players are not required to have played a minimum amount of regular season games to be eligible.

### **Residency Eligibility Requirements**

- School Enrollment Verification
  - The physical school building must be within your league boundaries
  - The player must have been enrolled with that school prior to October 1st of the current academic year.

#### • Home Verification

- The family must provide one piece of documentation from each of the three groups.
- The dates on the documentation **must** be **2/1/2024-2/1/2025** anything dated prior to or after those dates will not be accepted.
  - **GROUP ONE** 1. Driver's License 2. School records 3. Vehicle records (i.e., registration, lease, etc.) 4. Employment records 5. Insurance documents
  - GROUP TWO 1. Welfare/child care records 2. Federal records (i.e. Federal Tax, Social Security, etc.) 3. State records 4. Local (municipal) records 5. Support payment records 6. Homeowner or tenant records 7. Military records
  - GROUP THREE 1. Voter's Registration 2. Utility bills (i.e., gas, electric, water/ sewer, phone, mobile phone, heating, waste disposal) 3. Financial records (i.e. loan, credit, investments, etc.) 4. Medical records 5. Internet, cable, or satellite records
